Worship Outline

1. Praise to God

Listen or sing along to the first two songs from our playlist:

- Joy To The World
- O Come All Ye Faithful

2. Prayer to God

Think about the blessings of Christmas and thank God specifically for them. You may choose to do this silently or invite those present to share a short, simple prayer and designate someone to conclude that time.

3. Read and Consider God's Word

READ LUKE 1:30-33

Q: Mary receives three statements here about her baby: you will call His name Jesus, He will be called Son of the Most High, His Kingdom will never end. How can each of these be helpful in sharing our faith?

READ LUKE 2:8-12

Q: Jesus' birth could have been announced to royalty, but the angels made their grand announcement to shepherds. Why do you think God made this choice?

READ 1 JOHN 5:11-12

Q: This passage tells us eternal life doesn't begin at Heaven, but begins right when we're saved. How can you try to remember each day you aren't just living an earthly life, but an eternal one?

4. Praise to God

Listen or sing along to the next song in the playlist

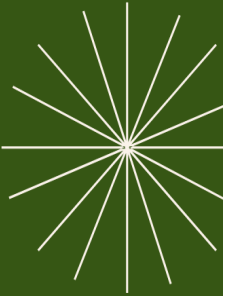
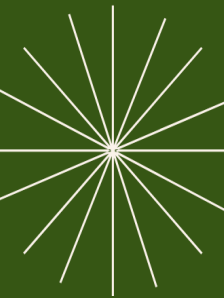
